Overall, the camp was a great success and the students gained valuable knowledge about organic farming.







Report

This activity helped to create awareness on the health benefits of curry leavesand encouraged them to plant a curry leaf in their houses as well as pass-on the knowledge gained. It all helped in developing environmental consciousness and social responsibilities among students.

As part of the Environment Day observance, on June 7, 2017, 40 students of the department of Zoology distributed curry leaves aplings in the neighborhood. Curry leaves are a rich source of iron and folic acid, helps in lowering blood cholesterol and sugar levels and also prevents premature greying of hair. As it is an unavoidable ingredient in most South Indian dishes, curryleaves is a requirement in all households. But we see that many switch to buy curry leaves from groceries to meet their needs instead of buying. Being treated with chemical insecticides to prevent pet attacks, the ones brought from grocers do pose health risks. Recognizing the importance of curry leaves, 23 saplings were distributed as part of this extension activity.

Mrs.Reemy Sara Mathayi, Assistant professor Department of Zoology, Mar Thoma College for Women, served as the program coordinator and handled the session.

The Session focused on Awareness on Health benefit oncurry leaves and encouraged them to plant the same.
