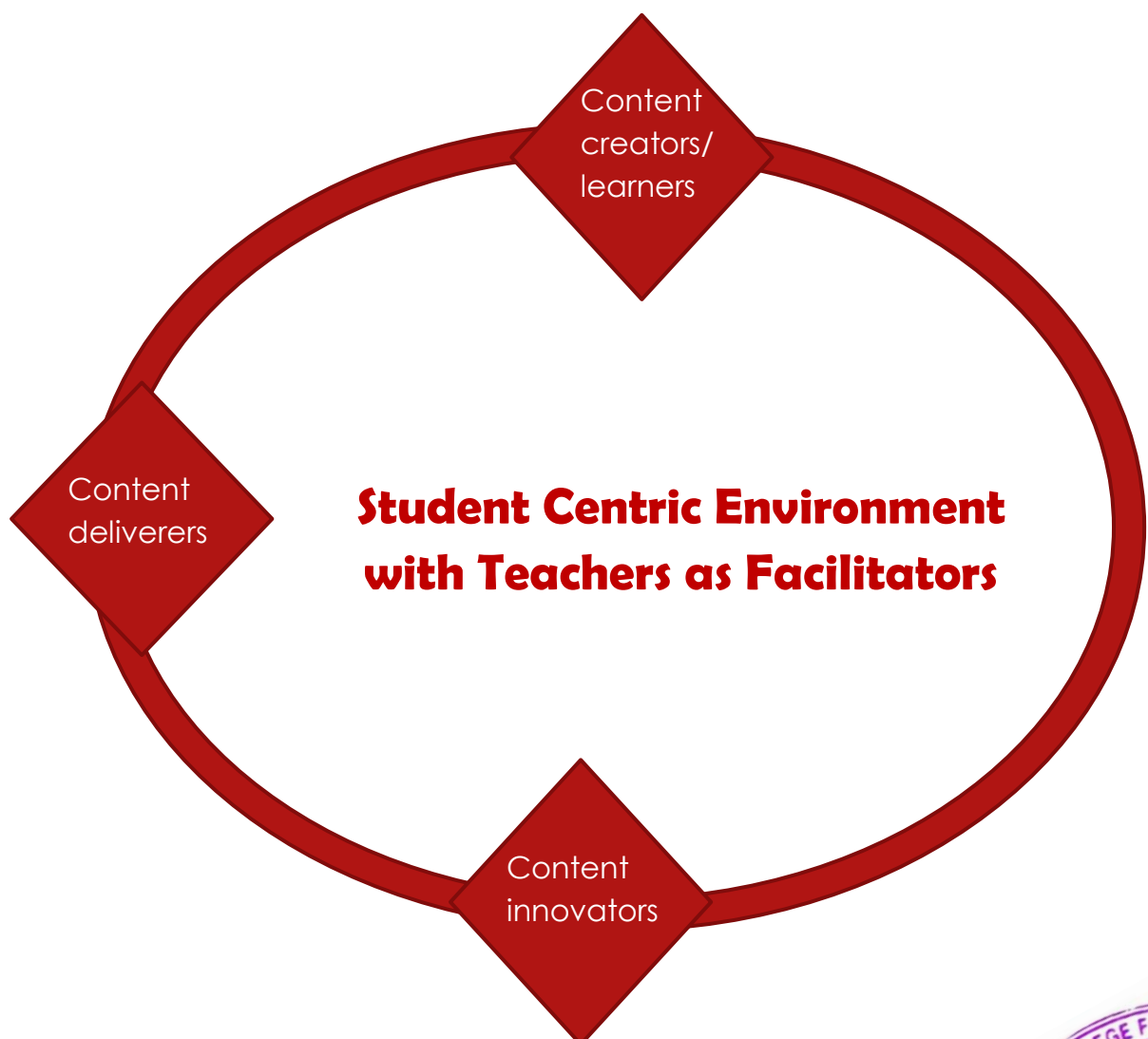
ENTRY LEVEL ASSESSMENT AND MONITORING

The conduct of *Entry level tests* the beginning of the graduate programme, its continuous assessment and adressal in the following years is one of the best teaching- learning practices followed by the Mar Thoma College for Women, Perumbavoor.

The system evolved with the intend of creating a more Student Centric Environment. The student herself became the focal point and targeted attention was given for challenges noticed. Students became content generators (answer-key preparations, educational videos), content deliverers (peer teaching) and content innovators (hackathons) through the guidance of the mentor. Students facing challenges were together supported by the mentor and the peer-teacher. This makes Teaching-Learning a collaborative effort.



Our entry-level assessments are designed to help mentors identify the challenges faced by the mentee in their reasoning, aptitude, general English and subject level. On the basis of the graded score obtained during the assessments, students were grouped into Advanced, Intermediate and Slow categories and each group was addressed accordingly.

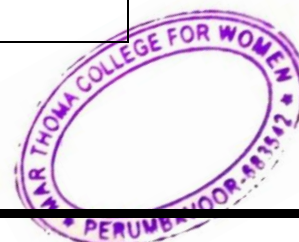
Advanced Learners were made cluster group leaders, encouraged for participation in workshops, hackathons (Institution Innovation Council and Young Innovator's Program) and trainings to enhance their proficiency.

Intermediate Learners were provided academic support and encouraged to upskill themselves through various activities like group discussions, debates, interactions, competitions.

Slow Learners were specifically addressed through remedial classes, SSP sessions and group learning with peers.

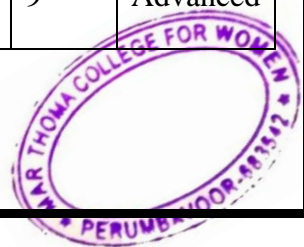
