The Department of Zoology celebrated "World Environment Day " on 07/06/2017 by distributing *Kariveppu* saplings to the neighbourhood. The program was coordinated by Dr. Biju Jacob Thomas, Associate Professor , Mar Thoma College for Women. Curry leaves are a rich source of iron and folic acid, helps in lowering blood cholesterol and sugar levels and also prevents premature greying of hair. As it is an unavoidable ingredient in most South Indian dishes, *Kariveppu* is a requirement in all households. But we see that many switch to buy curry leaves from groceries to meet their needs instead of buying. Being treated with chemical insecticides to prevent pet attacks, the ones brought from grocers do pose health risks. Recognizing the importance of curry leaves, 23 saplings were distributed to the neighbouring houses,

This activity helped to create awareness on the health benefits of *Kariveppu* and encouraged them to plant *aKariveppu* in their houses as well as pass-on the knowledge gained. It all helped in developing environmental consciousness and social responsibilities among students.

The program was helpful to create an awareness about the importance of Science among the students. Sky watch program was a new experience for the students and it was helpful for the students to learn the basics of astronomy.





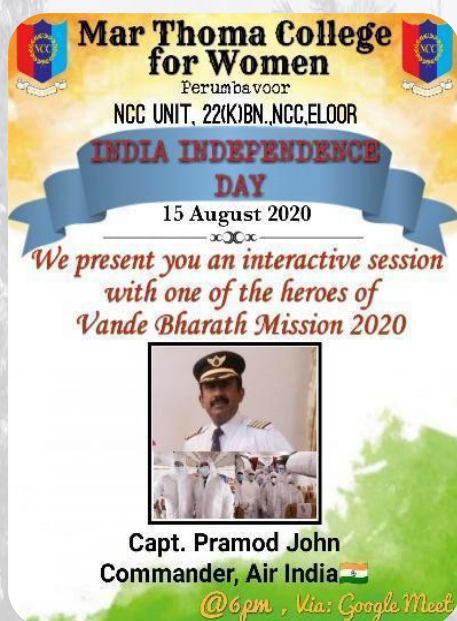
his experiences and insights about the war and the valor displayed by the soldiers.

TREASURE HUNT COMPETITION

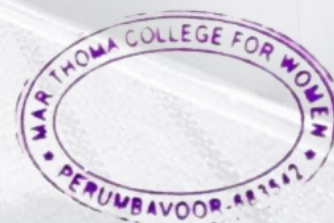
