

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



- 5. Support the students of both 1st Party(Yeldo Mar Baselios College,Kothamangalam) & 2nd Party (Mar Thoma College For Women,Perumbavoor) with different learning environment and uplift them through student exchange and collaborative learning.

2. General Terms of MOU

- **2.1 Duration of MOU:** This MOU shall be operational upon signing and will have an initial duration of one year. All activities conducted before this date within the vision of the joint collaboration will be deemed to fall under this MOU.
- **2.2 Coordination:** In order to carry out and fulfill the aims of this agreement, each party will appoint an appropriate person(s) to represent its organization and to coordinate the implementation of activities.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

- 2. The Second Party will provide the services based on the discussion with the First Party. After receiving the request for service, the Second Party shall consider the resource and effort estimates required and the estimations will be passed on to the First Party. Once the approval is given, the services will be delivered.
- 3. The modes of communication will be through telephone, and Emails, between the designated contact persons. The Principal or any other person designated by the Principal will be the official contact point for the First Party and Mr. Akhil Kumar or any other person from ipsr solutions limited designated by him shall be the official contact point for the Second Party.
- 4. No party shall disclose any information to any third party concerning the matters under this MoU unless required by the provisions of law. Any information, whether proprietary or not, to be contained in reports or disclosed by one Party to the other Party, shall be kept strictly confidential by the receiving Party and shall not be disclosed to any third party without the prior written consent of the original disclosing Party. - 7. In the event of any differences or disputes arising out of the interpretation or application of the provisions of this MoU, the parties shall immediately consult each other with the view to expeditiously resolve such differences or disputes in a spirit of mutual understanding and cooperation.



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8. Assignment by a Party of its rights and obligations under this MoU to any other Party shall be subject to the consent of the other Party to the MoU

VALIDITY

Perumbavoor, Kerala and ipsr solutions limited, ML Road, Kottayam, Kerala agree to this MoU by approving the above terms and policies for the Implementation of LMS and Online Education Systems.
