WORKSHOP ON GST

Visit To Mangalavanam

The final year degree B. Sc. Zoology students were taken to Mangalvanam on July 8, 2017. Mangalavanam is an ecologically sensitive area situated at the centre of the Indian city of Kochi. Covering about 2.74 hectares, it also houses a shallow tidal lake connected with Kochi backwaters by a canal. This area which is situated behind the Kerala High Court building contains many types of mangroves. Managalavanam is often regarded as the "green lung of Kochi", considering its role in keeping the city's air pollution under check. The area is also a roosting place for many kinds of resident and migratory birds.


As part of observance of World Environment Day, on June 7, 2017, the students of Department of Zoology distributed curry leaf saplings in the neighborhood. Curry leaves are a rich source of iron and folic acid. It helps in lowering blood cholesterol and sugar levels and also prevents premature greying of hair. As it is an unavoidable ingredient in most South Indian dishes, *Kariveppu* is an unavoidable requirement in all households. Nevertheless due to lack of its availability, many switch to buying curry leaves from groceries to meet their needs. Being treated with chemical insecticides to prevent pet attacks, the ones brought from grocers do pose health risks. Recognizing the importance of curry leaves, 23 saplings were distributed as part of this extension activity. The extension activity was coordinated by Dr. Biju Jacob, Head, Department of Zoology.



IQAC & DEPARTMENT OF MATHEMATICS

SEMINAR ON MATHEMATICAL MORPHOLOGY

Department of Mathematics, organized a seminar on 'Mathematical Morphology' in association with IQAC of the college. The seminar was held on 27 September, 2017. Dr. Bino Sebastian V, Assistant Professor, M. A. College, Kothamangalam, served as the resource person. The session began with an overview of Mathematical morphology and its applications in various domains such as image processing, pattern and signal processing. The main focus of the session was on how to process images using mathematical morphology. The seminar helped to understand the image processing technique based on mathematical morphology. The session was very enlightening and beneficial to the students of the department. An interactive session with the resource person was conducted after the talk. The seminar was attended by 109 students of the department.



SEMINAR ON MATHEMATICS IN TEJAS DESIGN

Department of Mathematics organized a national seminar for students and faculty on 'Mathematics in Tejas Design' on 4 January 2018. The seminar was attended by 111 students and 8 faculty members. Dr. Indira Narayanaswamy, Research Professor, Ramaiah University of Applied Sciences, Bangalore was the resource person.

In the first session of the seminar, the historical growth of Indian Aviation industry, showcasing the indigenous efforts for fighter aircraftdevelopment, in particular HF 24- MARUT and HF 25, followed by the conceptualization of LCA (Light Combat Aircraft) programme, were presented. A short overview of LCA, christened as TEJAS, highlighted the significant applications of Mathematics in its design at various stages.

The second session started with the discussion about Design Optimization of transport aircraft wing. After a brief mention of the Basic theory in Optimization (gradient based as well as Genetic Algorithm based), a typical case study of the wing design of a civil transport aircraft were discussed using genetic Algorithm. The session concluded by listing few applications of Aerodynamics.

IQAC & DEPARTMENT OF CHEMISTRY

Workshop on Paper Bag Making

Plastic bags have dominated the present bag market against other alternatives. However, the dominant use of plastic bags has been questioned as a result of its nonbiodegradable nature and its environmental impact. As part of the green initiative of the Department of Chemistry, students made 50 paper bags and distributed them among the teachers to create awareness about the disadvantages of the usage of plastic bags and plastic products. This paper bag making takes a cursory look at plastic bags and some available alternatives in order to highlight their impact on the environment throughout their life cycle. 41 students of III B.Sc. Chemistry actively participated in this program on 18 July 2017, under the guidance of Mrs. Sumaya P.A., Faculty, Department of Chemistry. Students were divided into five groups and the steps involved in making of paper bags was demonstrated to them. The first paper bag was given to Dr. Lisy Cherian, Principal of the college. The objective of the drive was to develop the habit of recycling among students by teaching them how to make paper bags and also to create awareness on the damage caused by plastic bags to the environment.




IQAC & Department of English

The novel was written by the noted English author, poet and Mathematician Lewis Carol in 1865. With its fantastical tales and riddles, it became one of the most popular works of English language fiction. It was notably illustrated by the British artist John Tenniel. The story centers on Alice, a young girl who falls asleep in a meadow and dreams that she follows the White Rabbit down a rabbit hole. She has many wondrous, often bizarre adventures with thoroughly illogical and very strange creatures. However, by the end of the novel, Alice realizes that the characters are only a pack of cards, and she then awakens from her dream. The story was originally told by Carroll to Lorina, Alice, and Edith Liddell (the daughters of Henry George Liddell, dean of Christ Church, Oxford.)

Workshops on Digital Marketing




Post Flood Water Analysis

SEMINAR ON FILM STUDIES



PERFORMANCE OFHAYAVADANA AND SEMINAR ON GIRISH KARNAD



SEMINAR ON "APPLICATIONS OF RANDOM MATRIX THEORY IN MODERN STATISTICAL AND MACHINE LEARNING RESEARCH"

The Department of Mathematics organized a seminar on "Applications of Random Matrix Theory in Modern Statistical and Machine Learning Research" on 2 August 2019. Dr. Sandhya E, Associate Professor, Prajyoti Niketan College, Pudukkad, served as the resource person. The concept of random matrix theory and its relevance in modern data analysis was introduced to students. Dr. Sandhya discussed how random matrix theory provides a framework for analyzing large datasets and how it can be used to extract meaningful information from noisy data. The challenges faced during the use of random matrix theory in data analysis, including the need for robust statistical methods and the need to account for non-random structures in data, were also discussed.



WORKSHOP ON NUMERICAL ANALYSIS WITH PYTHON 3

Department of Mathematics in association with IQAC organized a two-days workshop for students and faculty on "Numerical Analysis with Python 3" on 3 and 4 January 2020. The workshop was conducted in collaboration with Kerala Mathematical Association (KMA). Dr. Sunny Kuriakose, Dean of FISAT & Academic Secretary of KMA, inaugurated the workshop. In the first session of day one, history of Python programming language, set up of python programming environment for Windows, variables and data types, operations in python were explained.

The second session of day one of the workshop was led by the students on the installation of Anaconda software. Inbuilt data structures in Python were also discussed. At the concluding part of the workshop, students were given a python project to code and execute at runtime, followed by a session where students were asked to speak and express their experience of the workshop and what they learned during it.

IQAC & DEPARTMENT OF ENGLISH

Webinar on "Between Once Upon a Time and Happily Ever After; Gender in Fairy Tales"

The Department of English in association with IQAC organized a national webinar on the topic "Between once upon a time and happily ever after; gender in fairy tales" on 16 November 2020. The resource person for the webinar was Dr Vrinda R Chanth, Assistant professor, Government college of Daman. The presidential address for the webinar was given by Ms Chaithanya Elsa Achankunju, Head of the Department of English.

Fairy tales are the common thread throughout the childhood of a human being. They have been morphed into a very effective means for exercising power over women and to maintain gender inequality. In children's books, the character's gender determines the character's activities: male characters are more adventurous and physically active, while female characters are more passive and reserved. If they are presented with the idea that girls cannot do math, or boys cannot like the color pink, then that skewed image of gender becomes a part of how that child sees himself or herself. The acceptance of these stereotypes may limit what children think themselves to be capable of throughout their lifetime, and can lead to the perpetuation of the stereotypes to future generations. The plots of most tales' impress upon their readers that the home is where a woman belongs and, furthermore, she receives both social and financial security through marriage into the home of her "Prince Charming". In most fairy tales, in order for the woman to have a proper "happily ever after", marriage is a must.

The students had the opportunity to understand about the gender stereotypes that prevail in the society and the need to take a stand against all of it. The programme had a total of 89 participants.

Webinar on "Quick Relook at the Practice of Teaching English Language and Literature"

A national webinar on the topic "A quick relook at the practice of teaching English language and Literature" was conducted by the English Association in association with IQAC on 4 May 2020. The resource person for the day was Mr George Mathew, Associate Professor of English (Retired) at Mar Ivanios College, Thiruvananthapuram. The presidential address of the programme was given by the Principal.

The webinar aimed at emphasizing the use of literature as a popular technique for teaching both basic language skills (reading, writing, listening and speaking) and language areas (vocabulary, grammar and pronunciation). The session discussed about, why language teachers use literary texts in the foreign language classroom and gave the notion that the main criteria for selecting suitable literary texts in foreign language classes is to make the reader familiar with the underlying reasons and criteria for language teachers' using and selecting literary texts.

The students became aware that they become more productive and adventurous when they begin to perceive the richness and diversity of the language they are trying to learn and learnt to make use of some of that potential. A total of 85 participants took part in the online session. The programme ended with a vote of thanks presented by the Association Secretary.

Webinar on "Online Training Programme on Academic Writing"

An "Online Training Programme on Academic writing" was conducted by the Department of English in association with the IQAC on 11 February 2020. The resource person for the programme was Dr Meena Panikker, Associate Professor at P A First Grade College, Mangalore. The presidential address for the programme was presented by the Head of the Department of English, Ms. Chaithanya Elsa Achankunju.

Academic writing or scholarly writing is nonfiction produced as part of academic work, including reports on empirical fieldwork or research in facilities for the natural sciences or social sciences, monographs in which scholars' analyses culture, propose new theories, or develop interpretations from archives, as well as undergraduate versions of all of these. Though the tone, style, content, and organization of academic writing vary across genres and across publication methods, nearly all academic writing shares a relatively formal prose register, frequent reference to other academic work, and the use of fairly stable rhetorical moves to define the scope of the project, situate it in the relevant research, and to advance a new contribution. There are a number of areas of importance in all academic and scholarly writing. While some areas, such as the use of appropriate references and the avoidance of plagiarism, are not open to challenge, other elements, such as the appropriate style, are contested. Since writing is the main method of academic communication. It is also the most difficult skill for most students to master.

The session provided the 78 participants with an idea on how to write academic papers and made them aware about what makes the paper a standard piece of writing. The programme ended with the vote of thanks delivered by the association representative from II B A English.


National Webinar on "Change Your Mind, Change Your Life: Coping up with the *Girl-Stress*"




IQAC & DEPARTMENT OF COMPUTER APPLICATION


Webinar on Reading Day

Seminar On Introduction to Environmental Humanities

A seminar on the topic, "Introduction to Environmental Humanities" was organized by the English Association in association with IQAC on 14 December 2021. The resource person for the day was Dr. Raghul V Rajan, Assistant Professor, Aligarh Muslim University, Malappuram Centre.

Environmental Humanities is a multidisciplinary field where westudy the History, Literature, Philosophy, and Anthropology of environmental problems, such as climate change. Environmental humanities employ humanistic questions about meaning, culture, values, ethics, and responsibilities to address pressing environmental problems. It aims to help bridge traditional divides between the sciences and the humanities, as well asbetween Western, Eastern, and Indigenous ways of relating to the natural world and the place of humans within it. Environmental humanities did not just emerge from Western academic thinkers, indigenous, postcolonial, and feminist thinkers have provided major contributions. These contributions include challenging the human-centered viewpoints that separate "nature" and "culture" and the white, male, Europeanand North American-centric viewpoints of what constitutes "nature".

The lecture helped the students to realize the importance of preserving our environment and also about how they can make use of the environmental resources available to achieve their true potential. Atotal number of 56 participants participated in the lecture.

Seminar On Dalit Literature: An Introduction

A seminar on "Dalit Literature: an introduction" was organized by English Association in association with the IQAC of the college on 14 March 2022. The resource person for the programme was Mr. Vishnu Narayanan, Assistant Professor, Department of English, Institute of English, Thiruvananthapuram. The evolution of Dalit literature was explained at the beginning of the session. Dalit literature emerged in the 1960s in the Marathi language, and it soon appeared in Bangla, Hindi, Kannada, Punjabi, Sindhi, and Tamil languages, through narratives such as poems, short stories, and autobiographies, which stood out due to their stark portrayal of reality and the Dalit political scene. Dalit literature is a body of texts produced by writers whose caste background used to be referred to as "Untouchable" or "scheduled caste", and whose writing engages with caste, caste discrimination. In the second part of the session the resource person explained how Dalit literature is a representation of Dalit reality and also the prominent Dalit works. The primary aim of Dalit Literature is the liberation of Dalits. Students actively interacted with the resource person and learned how to make their academic papers on Dalit Literature efficient. The 88 participants of the session were able to realize that the true motive of Dalit Studies is the liberation of the Dalits.



Seminar On Imagining Justice in Postcolonial Indian Literature

A national webinar on the topic "Imagining Justice in postcolonial Indian Literature" was conducted on 15 February 2021 by the English Association in association with IQAC. The resource person for the day was Dr. Reju George Mathew, Assistant Professor, NationalInstitute of Calicut, Kerala.

The examination conducted by the National Testing Agency on behalf of the University Grants Commission. The NET exam introduced in the year of 1989 is regarded as one of the hardest exams to clear. Candidates who have secured at least 55% marks (without rounding off) in

Master's Degree or equivalent examination from universities or institutions recognised by UGC in Humanities (including languages) and Social Science, Computer Science & Applications, Electronic Science etc. are eligible for this test.

The participants of the Workshop were able to get a clear vision about the examination and were motivated to qualify the test in the future. The Resource Person interacted with the participants, clearing their doubts and orienting them in the right direction.


Seminar on Research Ethics






National Webinar on Know Your Worth: Unpaid Labour- The Indian Scenario

IIC and IQAC : Seminar on Innovations in Solar Power


