

In commercial and industrial real estate, an energy audit is the first step in identifying opportunities to reduce energy expense and carbon footprint.


The primary objective of Energy Audit is to determine ways to reduce energy consumption per unit of product output or to lower operating costs.

A home energy audit is a service where the energy efficiency of a house is evaluated by a person using professional equipment with the aim to suggest the best ways to improve energy efficiency in heating and cooling the house. A home energy audit is often used to identify cost effective ways to improve the comfort and efficiency of buildings. In addition, homes may qualify for energy efficiency grants from central government.


The judgment was done by the faculties of the




**Oath Taking


their own food and lead a healthy lifestyle.




Tilling Event



drives were organized to impart the significance of plastic free and clean surroundings among the students.Students become aware about the consequences of




The Department of Zoology in collaboration with the Social forestry wing of the Kerala Forests and Wildlife department launched a “Vidyavanam” project in the College campus. The program was inaugurated by Mr. Zakir Hissain(Municipal Chairman, Perumbavoor), in the presence of the DFO, Ernakulam, Ward Counsellor and Dr, Sujo Mary Varghese(Principal-in-charge) of on July 1, 2021.

Vidyavanam is a mini forest project introduced by the Social Forestry wing based on Miyawaki concept. It is urban afforestation by creating dense and native forests which involves planting several native species in a small area and making it a self-sustaining green space in 3-4 years. Land for setting up Vidyavanams is prepared by digging soil up to 1m and adding cow dung and other organic fertilizers. The saplings planted include that of fruit bearing and medicinal plants, among others.

The initiative has helped in increasing the green cover of the campus and definitely facilitated student centric learning especially in connection with Botany.


As the pens were bought from a physically challenged individual who makes his livelihood from the sale of these pens, this responsible act of love by the department of Zoology served 2






**Campus Cleaning
