








BLOOD DONATION CAMP








KARGIL VIJAY DIWAS







INDEPENDENCE DAY








AWARENESS CLASS ON DRUG ABUSE


GANDHI JAYANTI

DAY AT SEA




SURVEY






depicted how the diseased are isolated from the society and asked them not to do so. Cadets were able to make them understand the need of supporting the diseased.




CATC 2022 (Combined Annual Training Camp)


