With utmost pleasure and gratitude, let me present before you the Annual Report of Mar Thoma College for Women, Perumbavoor, for the academic year 2024-2025. By the grace of God Almighty, who has guided us graciously over the last 41 years, we have come to the conclusion of another great academic year. May the good God we serve guide us along the paths ahead so that we may achieve greater things. The college thrived this year, successfully implementing new schemes and initiatives, enhancing academic and extracurricular activities, and improving infrastructure, thanks to the unwavering support of our Manager, Rt. Rev. Dr. Isaac Mar Philoxenos Episcopa, and the members of the Governing Council.

Programmes Offered

10 UG and two PG Programmes are offered by the college, out of which two UG Programmes and one PG Programme are in the self-financing stream. We also run an Integrated 5-year M.Sc. Programme in Basic Science – Physics sanctioned by the State Government under the New Generation Courses Scheme.

This year, as per the requirements of the New Education Policy (NEP) 2020 and the stipulations laid down by the Government of Kerala, we launched the Four-Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP) in all departments. This marks a significant shift in our academic structure, providing students with greater flexibility, interdisciplinary opportunities, and an extended research component. The FYUGP is designed to enhance skill development, improve employability, and foster critical thinking among students. The program also includes a strong emphasis on research and project-based learning, allowing students to engage in in-depth study in their chosen fields. As we implement this new structure, we are committed to providing the necessary academic and infrastructural support to ensure a smooth transition for both faculty and students.

Admission & Commencement of Classes

The college reopened after the mid-summer vacation on 3 June 2024. A total of 117 students enrolled in the Aided and Self-Financing streams this year, bringing the total student strength

to 428 as of December 2024. Classes for first-year UG programmes began on 1 July 2024, while first-year PG programmes commenced on 8 July 2024. Dr. Vineed Kumar K, Director of Physical Education, served as the Nodal Officer for the MG University CAP admission process.

The academic year 2024-25 commenced on 3 June 2024 with a prayer seeking God Almighty's blessings. The prayer, led by Rev. Bijoy M. John, College Chaplain, was organized by the Students Christian Movement in the College Auditorium.

Reports of Clubs

Student clubs play a vital role in fostering a dynamic and engaging campus environment at Mar Thoma College for Women, Perumbavoor. Beyond academics, these clubs provide students with a platform to explore their interests, develop essential skills, and cultivate a vibrant community. The club activities for the academic year 2024-2025 commenced on January 20, 2025, under the initiative of the Principal, Dr. Letha P. Cheriyan. The overall coordination of these activities was managed by the General Convenor, Dr. Vinod V., along with the respective club convenors and assistant coordinators.

1. Aesthetic Expressions Club

The Aesthetic Expressions Club, under the guidance of Convenor Miss Vishnupriya and assistant coordinators Mrs. Sreekutty, Mrs. Preethi, Mrs. Chaithanya, Mrs. Sherin T. Abraham, Mr. Jiju John Y, Mrs. Anandi, and Mr. Prasanth, is dedicated to nurturing creativity through various forms of artistic expression. Throughout the academic year, the club conducted numerous hands-on workshops and practice sessions that allowed students to explore their
